## Triage Screening at All El Proyecto Health Clinics

El Proyecto follows the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidelines and requires temperature screening. The COVID-19 pandemic makes it necessary to take additional steps to help keep our patients, staff and the community safe. We check the temperature of everyone who enters any of our clinics, including social service programs and employment centers. Everyone who enters is required to wear a mask or face covering. Triage questions are asked regarding COVID-19 symptoms, fever, cough, shortage of breath or difficulty breathing and travel status.

## WorkSource Center Assists Residents Across Job Seeking Spectrum


